

SIXTH FORM Dress Code

Dress Code

We expect members of the Sixth Form to maintain a high standard of dress and appearance whilst developing their own judgment and taste. Sixth Form students are expected to dress in a manner appropriate to their position as senior leaders of the school community and role models for the younger pupils.

Formal Dress Code

Students will be required to wear the formal dress code on public occasions, formal assemblies and when there is a particular request to do so. When the formal dress code is required, girls must wear a black suit, comprising of a formal suit jacket and a plain skirt, or tailored trousers, a white shirt with sleeves and a pair of smart black shoes. Boys must wear a dark coloured formal suit, a white shirt with sleeves and a tie of a sensible pattern, and smart black shoes.

Sixth Form Girls

Every day dress code

- A formal blazer of any colour this must be worn at all times.
- Outdoor coats must be removed and hung up whilst indoors.
- Smart blouse, shirt or top (this does not require a collar).
- Smart trousers or skirt of any colour/pattern.
- Smart dress of any colour/pattern. No leggings.
- Smart leather or imitation leather shoes or ankle boots of any colour.

Sixth Form Boys

Every day dress code

- Tie of a sensible pattern.
- Shirt designed to be worn with a tie (sports shirts, multi-coloured shirts, etc. are not permitted).
- Shoes may be black, brown or grey but must be of a plain design and with an unobtrusive method of fastening - suede shoes, boots, shoes with metal toe caps, trainers, etc. are not permitted.
- Smart trousers and jacket.
- V-necked jumper if worn with a shirt / collar.

Please note, failure to adhere to the dress code will result in a permanent move to the formal dress code for everyday wear.
