



A STELLAR YEAR GROUP ACHIEVED A STUNNING SET OF GCSE RESULTS

WITH A WHOLE HOST OF STAR GRADES



Pupils, parents and staff were jumping for joy at our Year 11 pupils' outstanding achievements - a group of young people who were just 14 years old during the first lockdown and who overcame a series of unprecedented challenges during their formative years. We were thrilled with the standards our pupils reached and were impressed by the personal qualities they displayed.

- More than 40% of all grades were stellar 9s and 8s (A**-A*), over 60% of results were at the very top level of 9-7s (A**-A) and more than 90% of grades were 9-5 (A**-B).
- In all, there were a magnificent 240 grade 9s (A**) and 690 grade 7-9s (A-A**): a superb constellation of top results!
- Two pupils achieved a perfect score of nine grade 9s (A**), eleven pupils had a stunning set of nine grades at 8 and 9 (A* and A**), thirty-one pupils had all 7-9s (A-A**) and eighty of our 130 pupils had more 7-9s (A**-A) than any other grade.
- Thirteen academic departments at BGS averaged a grade 7 (A), including Mathematics, English and Science and 100% grades in Further Maths were a grade 9 (A**).
- Very many congratulations to all our GCSE pupils on their truly sparkling results!

"Many congratulations to our Y11s and to their teachers! The scale of their achievements should not be underestimated - these were young people who were just 14 years old when the pandemic began and who spent much of their formative years learning from home, supported by their teachers and parents. To have achieved the stellar results, given the challenges faced, was absolutely incredible. The average grade was a grade 7 (A) and there were a stunning 465 grades at the 8-9 (A*/A**) level but some of the most extraordinary achievements lay behind the headlines and were personal triumphs over adversity known only to the individuals involved. This was indisputably an A grade yeargroup - academically, as the results demonstrate - but even more importantly, in terms of character. To say we were over the moon for our pupils and teachers is an understatement."



A Level results and places at top universities - and we could not have been happier for them.


In all, the class of 2022 achieved well **over 100 A*** and **A grades** between them.

Twenty-one students, over a quarter of the cohort, had a clean sweep of A and A* grades.

Half of our students reached the 'gold standard' with a suite of grades at B and above.

And there was, once again, a perfect 100% pass rate!

So many challenges had been overcome on the journey to this point: we are absolutely thrilled that our students' and teachers' hard work had paid off.

PASS RATE ONCE AGAIN AND EXCEPTIONAL UNIVERSITY SUCCESSES



The key aim of BGS Sixth Form is to prepare students to win places on the course and at the university of their choice and it appears that the vast majority of students have, once again, succeeded in gaining a place on the course and at the university of their choice.

Bury Grammar School continues to provide excellent preparation for our students committed to studying the most competitive courses.

Education is all about the journey through life and learning, but it is also about where that journey leads. We were thrilled that all of this year's leavers were delighted with their destination post BGS and over 75% of them had a place on their 1st or 2nd choice course. Almost half are attending Russell Group universities and a number are headed for highly competitive courses at universities such as **Oxford**, King's College London, Durham and Bristol.

UNIVERSITY OUTCOMES 2022

The hard work and brilliant results of our 2022 leavers provided lots of exciting future options whether that be attending a Russell Group university or taking up a place on a prestigious apprenticeship.

The number securing their 1st/2nd choice course was fabulous to note, as was the success rate among those who have opted for prestigious apprenticeships.

BGS students have now moved on to courses ranging from Medicine, Engineering, **Architecture, Business, History and Psychology** to Law, History, Art, Economics, Politics, Fashion Design, and Languages at universities throughout the UK and further afield.

Computer Science was particularly popular this year, with many choosing a year in industry as part of their course. Psychology continued to be both a very popular A Level and degree level choice and courses in the Humanities took our students to universities the length and breadth of the country this September.

Medicine, dentistry and nursing have also historically been highly sought-after career choices at Bury Grammar School, and our students have continued to achieve places in these fields this year. It is probably no surprise that sport was also the driving force behind a number of our 2022 leavers following this pathway at university.

Whatever had been our students' dream option was the one with which we have supported them.

Vice School Captain Ben achieved A* and A grades in Business, Economics and English Language and is studying Business Management at Newcastle University.

School Captain Joe is reading Philosophy and Theology at The University of Oxford after achieving top A*s and A grades in Biology, Mathematics, Religious Studies and his EPQ.

Head Girl **Chloe** secured a place on the highly competitive Ernst and Young degree apprenticeship programme after gaining top grades in Business, Economics and German - an incredible achievement!

Deputy Head Girl Nadia achieved A*, A and B grades in Biology, French, Psychology and her EPQ and is studying Paramedic Science at Liverpool John Moores University.

> Daneyal achieved a clean sweep of A*s in Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Mathematics and his Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) and is studying Computer Science with a Year in Industry at the University of Liverpool.

Mackenzie is studying for his degree in War Studies and History at King's College London, after gaining all A* grades in Economics, History

René is studying Natural Sciences at the University of Leeds after gaining all A* grades in Biology, Chemistry

Madiha has gone to study Medicine at the University of Sunderland after gaining top A* and A grades in Biology, Chemistry, Religious Studies and her EPQ.
















GCSE AND A LEVEL GRADES: HOW DO THEY COMPARE?


