Theology Essay Competition (Years 12-13) - A Level students are invited to submit an essay of up to 1,500 words on one of the questions below:

- 1. Critically assess whether religion and science must always come into conflict.
- 2. Should the study of religion and confessional theology be taught in the same faculty?
- 3. 'It is conceivable that God does not exist. So God, if he exists, exists contingently.' Discuss.
- 4. How fair is it to describe the Council of Chalcedon as a failure?
- 5. 'Texts don't mean. People mean with texts.' Discuss with reference to the Bible.

Wells Festival of Literature <u>Young Poets competition</u> – open to secondary and postsecondary students aged 16-22. Poems must be no longer than 35 lines and the closing date is 30th June.

The <u>Orwell Youth Prize</u> – for secondary students aged 12-18, entries can be in any form, up to 1000 words. This year's task is to respond to this title: "The Future We Want". The closing date is **11th June**.

Institute of Acoustics (Years 7-13) - Careful measurement of sound is one of the key skills an acoustician requires in order to obtain accurate data for analysis.
