Dear Parents

The Sixth Form as the leaders of our school are required to attend some of our events to help and support our younger students. I am writing to inform you of these key dates and when students will be expected in school or where a study day has been allocated. If students would prefer to study in school, they of course may come in and use the Sixth Form Centre.

**Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> November** will be a study day for our Year 12 students. This will be an opportunity to visit universities or research apprenticeships. Year 13 will be required to attend school to support our Year 6 Experience Day.

**Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> November** is our Sixth Form Experience day and will be a Study Day for our Year 13 students. They should use this day to consolidate, complete work set by their subject teachers and finalise any outstanding UCAS or Apprenticeship applications. Year 12 will be required to attend school as normal.

**Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> January** is our Entrance Examination day and Year 12 students will be required to assist with the day. The Year 13 Prefect Leadership team will also be required in school. All other Year 13 students are not required to be in school and may use this time to consolidate post mock examination results.

**Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> February** Year 13 students will be required to attend school during the morning from 9.00am-12.00pm to support our Year 6 Entrance Interviews.

We are always very proud of our Sixth Form students and find their support invaluable during these key events for the school.
